Myra will remain in Kentucky for a few more weeks to help her mother. But we see the Lord's hand in allowing us to be back stateside during this time.

Furlough will probably bring us up to the holidays, and there are several other things that need tending to, such as teaching classes in the college and renewing our passports. Orlando and Junior still communicate with me from Brazil to ask questions or seek guidance, as does Knowledge; the young man I led to the Lord in Botswana. And another man, named Omphile, texted me from Botswana to send his blessings after my father-in-law's death. It's always good to hear from these men. Myra remains in touch with some ladies as well.

From Myra:

Thank you to everyone who reached out to us when Dad went Home. He often wondered why God let him live 14 years after his heart attack, when the doctors said he only had 2 years to live. He did not know the impact he had on people's lives, but we did, and I am thankful for the years God gave us with him. My nephew's wife said it well when she said, "Doctors said for a long time his heart didn't work. But I think his heart worked just fine % he loved well."

While helping Mom, I'm preparing to teach typesetting classes in Fargo next month and starting a typesetting project for Bearing Precious Seed in Greenwood, Indiana. Satan always fights when I start typesetting Scriptures, so I appreciate your prayers as I typeset and teach others to do it as well.
